## **Vessel Traffic Information**

The Buoyed Fairway provides a boat passage between the CalMac Jetty and Fisherman's Pier, thence towards Local Boat, Visitor Moorings and Marina Pontoons.

Both Fishing and Charter vessels operate from the Harbour and Marina Pontoons.

Passenger Ships anchor in the Northern approaches to Tobermory Bay or within Harbour Limits. Ship's Tenders transfer passengers to and from a Dedicated Shoreside Landing Platform.

Local Notices to Mariners will be displayed at the Harbour and on Website

### **KILCHOAN VEHICLE FERRY**

All vessels should give a Wide Berth whilst in the vicinity of the Ferry Service operating to and from Tobermory CalMac Pier and Slipway.

## **Recreational Craft - Local Regulations and Navigation Advice**

Within Harbour Limits, Recreational Craft should have their engine available for immediate use with the ability to engage the propeller. Craft should have names or show identifiable marks.

Vessels shall proceed at a safe speed for prevailing circumstances and conditions.

Keep your wash to a minimum between all moorings and pontoons.

### **Max speed 4 knots**

Prepare a Passage Plan before embarking on any voyage.

## **International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea – Rules 3 and 5**

*A small craft or sailing vessel shall not impede the passage of a power driven vessel which can safely navigate only within a narrow channel and is restricted in her ability to manoeuvre or is limited by her draught.*

*Every vessel shall, at all times, maintain a proper lookout by sight and hearing as well as by all available means appropriate in the prevailing circumstances and conditions so as to make a full appraisal of the situation and the risk of collision.*

## **Tobermory Harbour Radio - VHF Channel 68**

Vessels are managed through the 'Local Port Service'
